p. 699, Professor Horace B. Robertson, *New Technologies and Armed Conflict at Sea*.

The call to footnote number one should have come at the end of the first paragraph on the page. An additional footnote relating to the 1907 Hague Convention IX should be inserted as follows:

2. Convention Concerning Bombardment by Naval Forces, October 18, 1907, 38 Stat. 2351, 1 Bevans 681.

Subsequent footnotes should be renumbered accordingly.
